Submissions that do *not* contain source code will *not* be graded.

**Assumptions to make when taking this assessment:**

- The user will not enter negative numbers as input.
- Movie reviews are rated from 1 to 100.

**Development Standards:**

- Your Code must use a consistent variable naming convention.
- All subroutines (if any), functions (if any), and methods (if any) must be documented with comments explaining the purpose of the method, the input parameters (if any), and the output (if any).
- If you create a class, then you must use Javadoc comments.



***Note to Graders:***

- Output will vary for critic rating and overall movie rating due to the random double generated for the critic rating.
- Error message may differ from sample output

**Solution and Project**

**Program Execution**

- The program displays the correct movie number during input \_\_\_\_\_ 10 points
- The program displays the correct movie number during output \_\_\_\_\_ 10 points
- The program displays the average website rating to two decimals \_\_\_\_\_ 20 points
- The program displays the average focus group rating to two decimals \_\_\_\_\_ 20 points
- The program displays the average movie critic rating to two decimals \_\_\_\_\_ 20 points
- The program calculates the correct weighted percentage for each category \_\_\_\_\_ 30 points
- The program uses the Random method to originate the critic rating \_\_\_\_\_ 30 points

**Source Code Review**

- The source code is properly commented
  - A comment containing the contestant number is present \_\_\_\_\_ 10 points
- Methods and code sections are commented \_\_\_\_\_ 20 points
- Code uses try... catch for exception handling \_\_\_\_\_ 10 points
- Code uses a consistent variable naming convention \_\_\_\_\_ 10 points
